Stat. § 14-4, if any person shall violate an ordinanc of a county, city, or town regulating the operation or parking of vehicles, he or she shall be responsible for an infraction and shall be required to pay a penalty of not more than fifty dollar (\$50.00); and			
15 16 17	WHEREAS, to NC Session Law 2021-138, NC Senate Bill 300, if an ordinance creates a criminal penalty for violation, that penalty shall be stated within the section of the ordinance itself.

22 23 24	<u>Violation of Section.</u> A violation of this section shall be a civil violation subjecting the offender to a civil penalty in the amount of \$50.00 and shall constitute an infraction enforceable under G.S. 14-4.

Should a court of competent jurisdiction declare this ordinance or any part of this ordinance to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this ordinance or the Code of Ordinances of the County of Currituck, North Carolina.
